## HAZMAT/WMD Training First-Responder Operations

NAEMSP® is proud to partner with the education and training divisions of the International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF) to offer the First Responder Operations course. As operational medical directors, we may respond to assist in a HAZMAT/WMD incident. This course provides the knowledge and tools needed to protect health and safety, while covering basic defensive actions, personal protective equipment, hazard recognition and identification, pre-incident planning and scene management. The First Responder Operations course offers us an opportunity to learn about responding to HAZMAT/WMD in the out-of-hospital environment.

After completing this course, students will be able to describe and practice basic strategies to safeguard their health and safety when their work involves potential exposure to hazardous materials. Students will gain the knowledge and skills needed to:

- Recognize and identify the clues that determine the presence of HAZMAT/WMD
- Research and evaluate exposure information
- Make decisions and execute appropriate actions
- Implement defensive control measures that minimize risks to health and safety

This course may fulfill your agency’s training requirements for responders. The course is facilitated through small group activities and real-life case studies. Meets or exceeds OSHA (29 CFR 1910.120) and NFPA Standards (472).
